SIDEWALK IMPROVEMENT AND CULVERT REPLACEMENT PROJECT

Project Introduction

This proposed drainage and sidewalk improvement project will take place on Whitehead Road. It was initiated as a result of routine flooding occurrences on Whitehead Road at the crossing of Pocosham Creek. Issues include undersized pipe culverts and lack of designated pedestrian accommodations along the roadway.

The proposed improvements are bounded as shown within the highlighted area on the figure below and will consist of:

- Approximately 1,800 linear feet of new sidewalk and curb and gutter along the west side of Whitehead Road, beginning at the existing sidewalk at Elmbridge Road and ending at Daytona Drive
- Replacement of the existing culverts under Whitehead Road that convey Pocosham Creek
- Potential vertical adjustments to Whitehead Road to facilitate conveyance of Pocosham Creek



Project Schedule

Project Assignment: July 2019 (AK&K)

Survey & Preliminary Design: August–October 2019 (H&B Survey)

Engineering Design: August 2019–April 2020 (RK&K)

Construction Assignment: TBD

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT:

Field Investigation & Survey Work

Survey work will be performed by RK&K, H&B Survey, and Miss Utility to collect existing data for proposed design improvements. Residents may notice vehicles in the neighborhood and survey crews collecting data and performing field investigations. At times, the teams may need to access portions of private properties within the project area to collect information and to determine right of way boundaries.

Public Meeting

A public meeting will be held to present proposed improvements and receive feedback. The time and location of this meeting will be announced as the project progresses.

Project Duration

Overall, the design is planned to be completed by April 2020. The project is planned to be advertised or assigned for construction in May 2020. Prior to the commencement of construction, a letter will be sent to adjacent property owners to notify residents of the start date.
